



Sûreté nucléaire en France post-Fukushima (Post-Fukushima Nuclear Safety in France)

The March 11, 2011, Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear catastrophe in Japan has definitively demonstrated that accidents heretofore considered too improbable to protect against can indeed occur. In order to address the multiple and unprecedented nuclear safety failures thus revealed, the French government rapidly put in place a process for complementary safety assessments (CSAs called “Évaluation complémentaire de Sûreté or ECS in French) for the principal nuclear facilities.
